How to pack your camp medication



- All prescription medications must be in their ORIGINAL containers
- Medication must be prescribed to the camper with up-to-date instructions
- Medication must not be expired
- Medication is administered by our camp nurse and medical team
- Consider leaving non-prescription medications at home
- All medications, even OTC meds, must be kept with the camp nurse and medical team

How do I tell you about my camper's medical needs?

- The most important place to communicate about your camper's medical needs is in the medical section of the LCCC registration form. You can access this form at lakeciscochristiancamp.com, CAMP SESSIONS / CISCO SR.
- If this is your first time at camp, please feel free to talk more in depth with our medical team at check-in.



- To protect the safety of all campers from access to meds, all medications must be kept with the nurse. This applies to our
 campers and staff so there is no possibility of a camper getting into a staffers luggage and accessing medication.
- Exceptions are made for rescue inhalers, diabetic supplies and epi-pens. Just make sure you mention your camper will need to carry these things with them on the medical section of registration.

What meds should my camper bring?

- Please leave all non-prescription medications other than allergy medicine at home for the week.
- We're well stocked on everything else they might need see attached list.
- Pack any allergy meds (Flonase, Zyrtec, Claritin, Allegra and more). Save the space in your trunk on the rest.

When are meds given?

• Medication is given out at meals from Monday breakfast through Friday dinner and bedtimes. On arrival night, we will give out medication.

How should I pack my camper's meds?

- Make sure ALL PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION is in its ORIGINAL container. State regulations require all medication to be in their
 original containers so we cannot make exceptions.
- Place all camper's medications in a Ziploc bag labeled with their name, age and birthdate.
- State regulations will not let us administer medication in this way:
 - Expired
 - Prescribed to other people
 - Compounded or mixed at home, we can administer medicines that have been compounded/mixed by a pharmacy
 only. Our nurses are unable to mix or compound medicines together. If you need this, work with your pharmacy
 ahead of time.
 - Broken in half. We can't administer medicines that are cut or broken into smaller doses than prescribed.
 - Regulations require us to **follow the directions** on all medicines unless we have a note from a physician authorizing something different. If a bottle says it is for adult use only and it is checked in for a ten-year-old, we cannot administer it. This is often a problem for melatonin. Or if you request a higher dosage than what is listed on the medication directions, you'll need a doctor's note for that.

What about essential oils or vitamins?

• Due to the large quantity of medicines tracked and given out during the week, we do not administer essential oils or vitamins to campers. Please do not send them in your camper's luggage.

What about CBD oil?

• We do not administer CBD oil to campers, and we ask you do not pack it in your camper's luggage.

What about melatonin?

• You can send it, **but two important things to note**. Your camper will be going hard all. day. long. The likelihood of them needing something to help them fall asleep is low. In addition, by law we must follow the dosage directions on all medicines (including melatonin), unless we have a doctor's note stating otherwise.

How do I get my meds back?

• On Saturday you can pick up your meds from a member of the medical team in the MPB (Multi Purpose Building). Please don't forget!

Bring your photo ID so we can verify we are giving the meds back to the right person.
